

APPENDIX 6 – Course Requirements (Practitioner Education)

The Prescribed Core Subjects and available elective subjects are listed for each award below.

Graduate Certificate in Applied Law

To receive this award, students are required to complete any two subjects in the Postgraduate Program. Students are precluded from completing the Capstone Project as part of this award.

Graduate Certificate in Applied Law (Government and Public Sector Law)

To receive this award, students are required to complete two subjects: GOV1 – Foundations of Government & Public Sector Law and one elective subject from the following list:

- GOV2 Privacy and Information Management;
- GOV3 Legislation and Its Interpretation; and
- GOV4 Contracting, Procurement and Probity

Graduate Certificate in Legal Operations

To receive this award, students are required to complete the two subjects below:

- LB11 Legal Operations; and
- One elective from the Master of Legal Business Management suite of subjects.

Graduate Certificate in Legal Business Management

To receive this award, students are required to complete the two subjects from the Master of Legal Business Management suite of subjects listed on the MLBM website.

Graduate Certificate in International Arbitration Practice

To receive this award, students are required to complete the two subjects below:

- ILP7 International Arbitration Practice
- ILP14 International Commercial Arbitration: The Arbitral Award & Award Writing

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law

To receive this award, students are required to complete four subjects in the Postgraduate Program. Students are precluded from completing the Capstone Project as part of this award.

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law (Commercial Litigation)

To receive this award, students are required to complete four of the subjects as set out below.

The following three core subjects:

- CLP1 Foundations of Commercial Litigation
- CLP2 Pre-trial Procedures
- CLP3 Dispute Resolution Processes

Plus any one of the following elective subjects:

CLP4 – Managing Complex Litigation



- CLP11 Building and Construction Disputes
- CLP12 Insurance Disputes
- CLP13 Intellectual Property Litigation
- CLP14 Insolvency Litigation
- CLP15 Corporations Litigation

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law (Criminal Law) - available to New Zealand students only

To receive this award, New Zealand students are required four of the subjects as set out below.

The following three core subjects:

- CRM1NZ Sentencing Law and Procedure;
- CRM2NZ Trial Practice and Procedure; and
- CRM3NZ Appeals and Procedure

plus any one of the following elective subjects:

- CRM4NZ Criminal Disclosure;
- CRM5NZ Search and Seizure; and
- CRM6NZ Mental Impairment

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law (Family Law)

To receive this award, students are required to complete four of the subjects as set out below.

The following three core subjects:

- FLP1 Foundations of Family Law Practice
- FLP2 Property, Maintenance & Child Support
- FLP3 Conducting Family Law Matters

plus any one of the following elective subjects:

- FLP11 Advanced Parenting Issues
- FLP12 Advanced Issues in Property, Maintenance & Child Support
- FLP13 Development & Management of a Family law Practice
- FLP14 Family Dispute Resolution
- FLP15 Advocacy in Family Law

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law (Government and Public Sector Law)

To receive this award, students are required to complete the four subjects set out below:

- GOV1 Foundations of Government and Public Sector Law;
- GOV2 Privacy and Information Management;
- GOV3 Legislation and Its Interpretation; and
- GOV4 Contracting, Procurement and Probity.

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law (In-house Practice)

To receive this award, students are required to complete four subjects as set out below.

The following two core subjects:



- IHP101 Foundations of In-house Practice
- IHP102 Managing Disputes

plus any two of the following elective subjects:

- IHP111 Acting as a Company Secretary
- IHP112 Managing the Legal Team
- IHP116 Multi-Disciplinary Project Management

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law (Wills and Estates)

To receive this award, students are required to complete four of the subjects as set out below.

The following three core subjects:

- WEP1 Foundations of Wills & Estates
- WEP2 Law and Practice of Estates
- WEP3 Construing and Drafting Wills

plus any one of the following elective subjects:

- WEP4 Family Provision
- WEP5 Contested Probate and Other Court Applications
- WEP6 Advanced Issues in Wills & Estates
- WEP7 Elder Law

Graduate Diploma of Family Dispute Resolution Practice – commencement prior to 2018

To receive this award, students are required to complete the coursework component consisting of the four core subjects and the practicum component consisting of 50 hours external practicum (or FDRP5 + 20 hours of external practicum). The four core subjects are:

- FDRP1 Mediation
- FDRP2 Understanding and Working with Families in Conflict
- FDRP3 Australian Family Law
- FDRP4 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution

Graduate Diploma of Family Dispute Resolution Practice - commencement from 2018 to 2020

To receive this award, students are required to successfully complete the coursework component consisting of the four core subjects and the practicum component consisting of 20 hours external practicum. The four core subjects are:

- FDR1 Family Law & Mediation;
- FDR2 Children's Matters, Family Law and Family Dispute Resolution;
- FDR3 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution; and
- FDR4 Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone.

Subjects outlined above must be completed sequentially. Students cannot move on to the next subject until they successfully complete the previous subject.



Graduate Diploma of Family Dispute Resolution Practice - commencement from 2021

To receive this award, students are required to successfully complete the coursework component consisting of the five core subjects. The five core subjects are:

- FDR1 Family Law & Mediation;
- FDR2 Children's Matters, Family Law and Family Dispute Resolution;
- FDR3 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution;
- FDR4 Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone; and
- FDR5 Virtual Simulated Practice

Subjects outlined above must be completed sequentially. Students cannot move on to the next subject until they successfully complete the previous subject. FDR4 – Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone covers 30 hours of practicum requirement and FDR5 – Virtual Simulated Practice covers remaining 20 hours of practicum requirement.

Students may seek exemption from completing FDR5 – Virtual Simulated Practice when they complete 20 hours of external practicum with an accredited FDRP.

Graduate Diploma of Applied Law in ASEAN+6 Legal Practice

To receive this award, students are required to complete any four of the subjects as set out below.

- ILP3 Negotiating and Drafting Cross-border Contracts
- ILP4 Cross-border Mergers and Acquisitions Practice
- ILP5 Banking and Finance Practice in ASEAN+6
- ILP6 Intellectual Property Practice in ASEAN+6
- ILP7 International Arbitration Practice
- ILP9 Trade and Investment in Asia
- ILP10 Capital Markets Practice in ASEAN+6

Graduate Diploma of Legal Business Management

To receive this award, students are required to complete four subjects from the Master of Legal Business Management suite of subjects.

Master of Applied Law (Family Law)

To receive this award, students are required to complete eight subjects as set out below.

The following five core subjects:

- FLP1 Foundations of Family Law Practice
- FLP2 Property, Maintenance & Child Support
- FLP3 Conducting Family Law Matters
- FLP11 Advanced Parenting Issues OR FLP12 Advanced Issues in Property, Maintenance & Child Support
- FLP00 Capstone Project (Family Law)

plus any three of the following elective subjects:

- FLP11 Advanced Parenting Issues (if not already chosen above)
- FLP12 Advanced Issues in Property, Maintenance & Child Support (if not already chosen above)



- FLP13 Development & Management of a Family Law Practice
- FLP14 Family Dispute Resolution
- FLP15 Advocacy in Family Law

Master of Laws (Applied Law) with a single major (including the New Zealand Program)

Students are required to complete at least four subjects within a major sequence (including a Capstone project) out of the eight subjects, in order to be awarded with that Major. Please note that subjects from Family Dispute Resolution Practice major cannot be completed as electives due to the pre-requisite nature of the subjects.

Master of Laws (Applied Law) without a major (General Masters)

A General Masters student can simply complete any eight Postgraduate Subjects in order to pursue a wider range of interests. One of the eight subjects must be a Major project. Please note that subjects from Family Dispute Resolution Practice major cannot be completed as electives due to the prerequisite nature of the subjects.

Master of Laws (Applied Law) with a double major

Students must elect the Double Major option during the course of their study. Students who complete their LLM degree cannot return to complete a Double Major, they must start a new Program.

Students in the Masters of Applied Law (Family Law) Program, are eligible to complete a Double Major if they transfer their enrolment to the Master of Laws (Applied Law) Program and complete 4 subjects of a new Major sequence area.

Double major example: Student wishes to Double Major in Wills and Estates and Property

- Wills & Estates subjects:
 - WEP 1: Foundations of Wills & Estates
 - WEP 3: Construing and Drafting Wills
 - WEP 4: Family Provision
 - Capstone: (Wills and Estates)
- Property subjects:
 - Prop 1: Foundations of Property Law
 - Prop 2: Buying and Selling Real Property
 - Prop 3: Commercial Leasing, Contracts & Transactions
 - Specified Credit or fourth property subject

Master of Laws (Applied Law) majoring in Family Dispute Resolution Practice – commencement before 2021

To receive this award, students must successfully complete eight subjects in total. To satisfy the course requirements of the Major, students must successfully complete the coursework component consisting of the four core subjects and the practicum component consisting of 20 hours external practicum. The four core subjects are:

- FDR1 Family Law & Mediation;
- FDR2 Children's Matters, Family Law and Family Dispute Resolution;
- FDR3 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution; and



• FDR4 – Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone.

Subjects outlined above must be completed sequentially. Students cannot move on to the next subject until they successfully complete the previous subject.

Students cannot complete this award until the practicum component has been satisfied. The remaining four subjects may be any Postgraduate Program subjects.

Master of Laws (Applied Law) majoring in Family Dispute Resolution Practice – commencement from 2021

To receive this award, students must successfully complete eight subjects in total. To satisfy the course requirements of the Major, students must successfully complete the coursework component consisting of the five core subjects. The five core subjects are:

- FDR1 Family Law & Mediation;
- FDR2 Children's Matters, Family Law and Family Dispute Resolution;
- FDR3 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution;
- FDR4 Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone; and
- FDR5 Virtual Simulated Practice .

Subjects outlined above must be completed sequentially. Students cannot move on to the next subject until they successfully complete the previous subject. FDR4 – Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone covers 30 hours of practicum requirement and FDR5 – Virtual Simulated Practice covers remaining 20 hours of practicum requirement.

Students may seek Recognition of Prior Learning for FDR5 – Virtual Simulated Practice when they complete 20 hours of external practicum with an accredited FDRP.

The remaining three subjects may be any Postgraduate Program subjects.

Master of Laws (Applied Law) with a double major where one of the majors is Family Dispute Resolution Practice – commencement before 2021

To receive this award, students are required to successfully complete eight subjects in total plus the practicum component:

- Coursework component for Family Dispute Resolution Practice major, which includes four core subjects:
 - FDR1 Family Law & Mediation;
 - o FDR2 Children's Matters, Family Law and Family Dispute Resolution;
 - o FDR3 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution; and
 - FDR4 Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone.
- Subjects outlined above must be completed sequentially. Students cannot move on to the next subject until they successfully complete the previous subject.
- Practicum component for Family Dispute Resolution Practice major by completing 20 hours of external work experience; and
- Completion of four subjects in the second major. As the students are completing the Capstone in the Family Dispute Resolution Practice, they are not required to complete the Capstone Project in the second major.

Students cannot complete this award until the practicum component has been satisfied.



Master of Laws (Applied Law) with a double major where one of the majors is Family Dispute Resolution Practice - commencement from 2021

To receive this award, students are required to successfully complete nine subjects in total:

- In order to satisfy Family Dispute Resolution Practice major, students must successfully complete the following core subjects:
 - FDR1 Family Law & Mediation;
 - o FDR2 Children's Matters, Family Law and Family Dispute Resolution;
 - FDR3 Advanced Family Dispute Resolution;
 - o FDR4 Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone; and
 - o FDR5 Virtual Simulated Practice
- Subjects outlined above must be completed sequentially. Students cannot move on to the next subject until they successfully complete the previous subject.
- FDR4 Case Management in Family Dispute Resolution Capstone covers 30 hours of practicum requirement and FDR5 – Virtual Simulated Practice covers remaining 20 hours of practicum requirement.
- Students may seek Recognition of Prior Learning for FDR5 Virtual Simulated Practice when they complete 20 hours of external practicum with an accredited FDRP.
- In order to satisfy the requirements of the second major, students must complete four subjects in that major. As the students are completing the Capstone in the Family Dispute Resolution Practice, they are not required to complete the Capstone Project in the second major.

Master of Laws (Applied Law) majoring in ASEAN+6 Legal Practice

To receive this award, students are required to complete eight subjects as set out below:

The following core subject:

ILP15 – Major Project

plus any three of the following ILP subjects:

- ILP3 Negotiating and Drafting Cross-border Contracts
- ILP4 Cross-border Mergers and Acquisitions Practice
- ILP5 Banking and Finance Practice in ASEAN+6
- ILP6 Intellectual Property Practice in ASEAN+6
- ILP7 International Arbitration Practice
- ILP9 Trade and Investment in Asia
- ILP10 Capital Markets Practice in ASEAN+6

plus 4 elective subjects or a second major

Master of Legal Business Management

To receive this award, students are required to complete the eight subjects as set up below:

- LB3 Business Strategy: Planning for Success
- LB00 Capstone, and:
- Any six elective subjects from the Master of Legal Business Management suite of subjects
